Lucet Instructions



1. Hold the lucet in your left hand. Bring the cord through the hole from back to front.



2. Hold the front cord with your thumb. Coming from the center of the lucet - wind the thread on the right horn, front to back.



3. Continue winding the thread on the left horn, front to back.



4. Wind once again on the right horn front to back. Making a figure eight.



5. You will have the cord and a lower loop on the right horn.



6. Lift the lower loop over the cord and horn to form your first stitch.



7. Be sure to hold the beginning cord with your thumb.



8. Tighten – by gently pulling the cord to the middle – from the back.



9. Turn the lucet clockwise with your left hand without pulling the cord.



10. This brings the cord over the right horn, forming the next stitch.



11. To form your second stitch, once again, lift the lower loop over the upper cord on the right horn.



12. Tighten down your loops by gently pulling the cord out to the right. This method will allow you even tension, and to have more consistent stitches.



13. Turn the lucet clockwise once again with your left hand, without pulling the cord.



14. This brings the cord over the right horn, forming the next stitch.



15. Hold the front cord tight with your thumb and the back cord with your left fingers.



16. Tighten the left hand loop by gently pulling the bottom right hand loop.



17. On the right horn, lift the lower loop over the upper cord.



18. This forms your next stitch.



21. Tighten the left hand loop by gently pulling the bottom right hand loop.



22. On the right horn lift the lower loop over the upper cord to form your next stitch.



19. Tighten down your loops by gently pulling the cord out to the right. This method will allow you even tension, and to have more consistent stitches.



20. Turn the lucet clockwise once again with your left hand without pulling the cord.



23. Tighten down your loops by gently pulling the cord out to the right. This method will allow you even tension, and to have more consistent stitches.

Repeat until your lucet cord reaches the desired length. Cut your working cord leaving about a 6 inch tail. Take the cord off the horn. Run the working cord through the loops and gently tighten down.

You have just completed a basic lucet cord.
